The globalized and networked world in our century looks totally different from the world of Virginia Woolf. Can we find any actuality in Woolf’s text now? Living in the 21st Century Asia, do we have anything in common with a writer who lived in early 20th century Britain? How can we teach Woolf to young students who will be leaders in the 21st century? Proposals for papers addressing these questions and the place of Woolf studies in today’s context are invited.

Please send 250-word abstracts in English as Word attachments. Do not include your name or other identifying details in your abstract.
